




It Came from Within, Andy Stanley




Fish, Andy Stanley

If someone does this study again, they should plan to invest some time in reworking the questions -- although these were an okay starting point. c) the other problem was a lack of scriptural references in these questions -- although certainly major texts on temptation were included and we added a couple of additional questions/scriptures. There is a balance to strike here as there is a lot to talk about in the book itself. My general take is that this is a powerful study. The American flavor of christianity tends to downplay spiritual warfare -- we tend to think of a red devil in tights when Satan is mentioned. The active role that Satan plays in our lives is not taken very seriously. |
